How to See a World Different From Our Own

#### February 23

Mystical Incarnations of God, Ezekiel 1:1–3:27

Many consider these chapters as laying the foundation of Jewish mysticism. What does it mean to see forms of the divine?

#### March 1

When God Abandons the Earth, Ezekiel 8 & 15-19
What does it mean for God to leave Israel? The principle of covenant insists that the People of Israel and God are locked in an eternal bond. If the People neglect it, then they run the risk that God will depart. In the wake of the exile, Ezekiel witnesses scenes of God's departure and the human behaviors that caused it.

Resurrection, Ezekiel 37-39

How does the prophet foresee resurrection and a new era of peace? The scenes of a Valley of Dry Bones coming to life and the end of the enemies Gog and Magog have inspired commentary, literature, and art.

## **Religious School Programs**

#### **Family Education**

Family Education happen several times a year for Pre-k through 7th grade.

These programs happen during Religious School from 9-10 am. These programs will highlight content taught within the Religious School

Curriculum as well as working on Social Action Projects.

#### B'nai Mitzvah Seminar

During 6th grade, families will come together once a month on Sunday morning to study the process of becoming B'nai Mitzvah as a family and will explore Jewish texts, what it means to participate in social action and social justice. As well as the overall significance of becoming B'nai Mitzvah. Monthly sessions will be taught by Rabbi Alex and Carly Valfer.

#### **Junior Congregation**

Students in Kindergarten through 6th grade will engage in the Shabbat Morning experience twice a month from 10:30-12:00 pm. Students will be divided into appropriate age groupings and will create a Shabbat experience with their peers that is age and developmentally appropriate. During this Shabbat morning experience students will help to lead their own service, engage in Torah study, discuss Mitzvot and middot and have the opportunity to spend Shabbat morning with their Religious School friends.

## Beyond B'nai Mitzvah

#### 8th Grade

Students in 8th grade will focus on Hot Topics regarding being a Jewish teen in today's world. Students will explore their place in the different communities that they are a part of. Students will also spend time being mentored as they begin their work as Madrichim. Students will continue their study of Jewish history from the creation of the State of Israel to present day. Students will also spend several sessions preparing for their Ta'am Yisrael Trip.

#### 9th Grade

Students in 9th grade will focus on their relationship with Israel. Students will explore what it means to be a Jew living in America as opposed to their Jewish peers living in Israel. Students will have the opportunity to study Midrash as their text study. Students will also continue their mentoring program as Madrichim and what it means to be a role model in our community. Students in 9th grade will engage in a several week curriculum around the Holocaust.
